

## CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT | CCCM



- A total of **516,390** people have been reached by CCCM services as of November 2021 (**120,594** IDPs in static response and **395,796** IDPs in mobile response)\*
- 55,381** meters of roads and **58,385** meters of drainage have been rehabilitated in Malakal PoC, and Naivasha and Bentiu IDP Camps
- 103** Partner meetings & consultations as well as **210** governance meetings have been held in Naivasha and Bentiu IDP sites and Hai Masna Collective Center.
- 27** Mobile assessments and responses have been conducted in Western Bahr el Ghazal, Warrap, Unity, Western Equatoria, Upper Nile and Jonglei States
- Through CCCM Cluster, about **820,000** people reached with CCCM Services in South Sudan, in addition to that CCCM Cluster trained **26** partners including **21** NNGOs on Camp Coordination and Camp Management.

## PROTECTION | PROTECTION



- The Protection team undertook **6** rapid deployment missions to Mundri, Mayendit, Raja, Nagero, Kuajena and Twic.
- 9** Organizations for Persons with Disabilities were engaged in four capacity building initiatives held in Juba and Yambio.
- 20** (15 males and 5 females) persons with visual impairments were supported to access functional literacy through Braille and 29 (15 males and 14 females) persons with hearing impairment benefitted from basic Sign Language trainings in Juba and Yambio.
- 339** (97 males and 242 females) were identified and provided with Individual Protection Assistance (IPA) including assistance contributed towards access to justice, access to health services, repairs for assistive devices for persons with disabilities among others.
- 924** individuals (603 male and 321 female) benefitted from Protection trainings including Protection Mainstreaming, Disability Inclusion, Human Rights and PSEA

## MIGRATION HEALTH | MHU



- Supported **24** health facilities in **3** counties through direct service delivery of health services including **9** Rapid response mission deployments during which 15 health facilities were supported and **2** rounds of Oral cholera vaccination campaigns conducted in flood-affected areas.
- 1,142,985** beneficiaries reached through direct delivery of Primary Health care services. (curative consultations, SRH services, Health promotion and nutritional screening during both routine and RRT mission deployments).
- 42,317** children and **19,671** pregnant and lactating mothers received routine immunization services and supplementary Immunization campaigns including administration of COVID-19 vaccination to **7,483** beneficiaries.
- Points of entry epidemic disease surveillance including temperature screening of **188,602** travelers at various PoEs.

## WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE | WASH



- 2,222,423** individuals reached with WASH services across South Sudan
- 666** handwashing devices, stations and facilities built and maintained as part of C-19 response, including support to 3 Points of Entry (POE) sites with C-19-related RCCE and IPC/WASH services
- 57** new boreholes built, 118 boreholes rehabilitated and 9 solarised water yards built
- 414** women trained in WASH Leadership, increasing their role and decision-making capacity in the WASH sector & **9,908** individuals benefiting from IOM's Community-Led Total Sanitation Programme
- 31,023** WASH NFI Kits and 10,179 Dignity Kits distributed
- 1,007** WASH volunteers Trained on PSEA and GBV Mainstreaming

## AREAS OF INTERVENTION



## SHELTER AND NON-FOOD ITEMS | S-NFI CLUSTER



- S-NFI Cluster partners assisted 1,010,830 (Male: 476,137, Female: 534,693) flood, conflict-affected and returnees with Shelter and NFI support.
- A total of 283,180 (47% male, 53% Female) people affected by floods, have been reached with S-NFI assistance. The cluster distributed more than 68,165 mosquito nets, 44,112 blankets, 24,001 rubber ropes and 37,961 plastic sheets to flood-affected people.
- A total of 46,814 individuals affected by sub-national violence in Tambura have been assisted by SNFI cluster partners with kitchen sets, tarpaulins, mosquito nets, blankets and rubber ropes to set up temporary shelter.

## MENTAL HEALTH PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT | MHPSS



- In 2021, MHPSS operations were expanded to Abyei Administrative Area, namely Abyei and Agok, Baliet County, Upper Nile as well as Raja and Bussere, Western Bahr el Ghazal. Focused, non-specialized MHPSS services were provided to **28,158** displaced beneficiaries (**14,727** women, **6,568** men, **4,094** girls and **2,769** boys).
- As part of MHPSS Technical Working Group coordination, MHPSS Unit contributed to the development of the draft of National Mental Health Strategy for South Sudan that will be adopted in 2022.
- Based on the internationally acknowledged and contextually adapted impact measurement tools, perceived wellbeing of **98** per cent of those severely distressed beneficiaries with whom the impact of the MHPSS intervention of IOM was assessed, have improved from the point of the enrollment till completion of MHPSS service provision.

## GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE | GBV



- Built capacity of **75** local community structures (members from Juba and Wau) on prevention of GBV through trainings on facilitation of gender dialogues and community activism (EMAP, school gender equality clubs).
- 632** community members (101 boys, 105 girls, 130 young men, 101 young women, 95 older men and 100 older women) participated in intergenerational dialogues to promote positive masculinities and reduce the use of violence.
- 4,955** community members reached through awareness raising radio outreaches. 11 radio shows aired.
- 370** women and girls formed into different **20** groups were reached with psychosocial and skills building, awareness raising and life skills activities in the locations of Juba, Jur River and Tonj South.
- Capacity of **106** MHPSS staff and volunteers (**55** female, **51** male) strengthened on ethical responses to GBV including responding to disclosures and providing ethical referrals for survivors.

## SHELTER AND SETTLEMENT | SS



- Shelter and Settlement assisted **256,801** flood and conflict-affected IDPs, host communities and returnees with the provision of Shelter and NFI items and disaster risk reduction activities Shelter and Settlement constructed and reinforced **14KM** of dikes, protecting more than **50,000** residents in Bor and Pibor. In addition to that, Shelter and Settlement formed nine Boma Disaster Management Committees to strengthen community-based disaster risk management activities and enhance communities' resilience.
- The Housing, Land and Property (HLP) team trained more than **90** government staff, community members and partners on HLP rights in Wau and Bentiu.
- 90** per cent of the beneficiaries report that the S-NFI assistance has helped them meet the urgent needs.

## HH & CTS



- IOM has completed the construction of Kodok (Upper Nile State) and Leer (Unity State) in partnership with MSB (Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency) and FCDO. The construction of the **third hub** in partnership with MSB and funding support from ECHO is underway in Raja (WBG State) is expected to be operational in early 2021.
- During the 2020 flood response scale-up In Jonglei, IOM has **constructed and handover** the humanitarian hub in Pibor to Plan international with funding support from SSHF.
- IOM successfully managed the operations of **two** largest humanitarian hubs in Malakal (Upper Nile State) and Bentiu (Unity State), providing accommodation and working space to more than **600** humanitarian workers and associates, representing **50** individual humanitarian organizations from South Sudan since 2011.
- 15,500** MT of cargo was transported across South Sudan on behalf of 80 humanitarian organizations under LOG Cluster service through IOM CTS Project (Common Transport Service). Out of 15,500 MT, 30% of cargo was transported to medium to long distances at remote locations, saving high cost for partners and in a timely manner.

## DTM



- DTM conducted interagency Food Security & Nutrition Monitoring System (FSNMS+) assessments in urban areas and IDP sites/PoC Site in six Counties (Juba, Yei, Bor, Wau, Malakal and Rubkona). DTM also conducted Village Assessment Surveys to map the facility infrastructure and services available in four Counties (Pibor, Akobo, Aweil South and Leer) covering **82** bomas.
- IOM DTM South Sudan worked closely with the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) and the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission (RRC) to build capacity and share data leading to endorsement of DTM's Mobility Tracking data as the country's baseline for IDPs & Returnees.
- 3800039** Individuals (IDPs and returnees) mapped through Mobility Tracking.
- 589,054** individual journeys tracked through 28 Flow Monitoring Points
- 992,593** active beneficiary individuals in DTM's Biometric Registration database.
- 1,014,431** individuals (IDPs & Returnees) from almost **800** events in 179 payams and 56 counties.

## CP



- Processed a total of **362** Cluster-approved pipeline requests from **21** S-NFI partners and **41** WASH partners, reaching a total of **60** counties affected by flooding, protracted and new conflict, disease outbreak, and malnutrition.
- Provided PPE to **350** requests approved by the COVID-19 inter-agency technical team for the benefit of health and frontline workers of **78** agencies/facilities.
- Transported a total of **2,709** metric tons (MTs) of critical WASH and S-NFI supplies to key IOM logistics hubs in Bor, Bentiu, Malakal, Rumbek, and Wau. Some **2,257** MTs were moved by road transportation. River transport took **344** MTs, and **49** MTs were moved by air cargo for emergency response.

## RRF



- During the year under review, RRF South Sudan responded to severe food insecurity affecting the most vulnerable population in South Sudan. The intervention cuts across **6** sectors and Partnered with **47** NGOs both national and international across **6** sectors of Agriculture and Food Insecurity, health, Nutrition, Protection, Shelter and Settlements/Non-Food Items, and WASH
- Reached over **2.1** million direct beneficiaries (Agriculture - **595,766**; Health - **840,984**; Nutrition - **29,778**; Protection - **94,000**; Shelter and Settlements - **184,536**; and WASH - **426,864**)

### PEACEBUILDING FUND

- Three community driven and multi state conferences supported safe and peaceful seasonal Cattle Migration
- Supported farmers and cattle keepers to resolve **94** specific conflicts or disputes through preventive dialogues and mobile peace response interventions
- Supported **447** Youth-At-Risk for reduced violence and enhanced social cohesion, through business skills and start-up kits to start small scale-businesses for improved livelihoods and economic empowerment
- Sensitized **15,000** community members on peaceful co-existence, social cohesion and reconciliation through youth-led Radio Talk Shows, Community theatre, and sports platforms

### COMMUNITY STABILISATION

- Rehabilitated **48**km community road, linking communities of Kuajena in WBG State and Pagol in Warrap state
- Infrastructure rehabilitation of **3** Health facilities, **2** traditional courts, **11** water yards and **4** handpumps, operationalized with Water Management Committees,
- Provision of diversified livelihood opportunities and skills for employment, including **71** participants benefited from bakery/sorghum/ restaurant/retailies/gridding skills;
- 112** participants of environmental conservation and energy saving stoves activities, village and crops farming groups

- 575 (480 F, 95 M)** women and youth enrolled in **17** functional adult literacy classes
- 32** radio talk shows on COVID-19 and peacebuilding were aired in Juba, Wau and Bentiu with an estimated reach of **37,000** listeners
