

IOM SOUTH SUDAN

SITUATION OVERVIEW AND RESPONSE TO THE CRISIS IN SUDAN Flash Update Report #2 | 28 April 2023



CONTEXT

The Sudan crisis continues to impact the humanitarian situation in South Sudan. As of 27 April, IOM/DTM and UNHCR teams have recorded a cumulative total of 10,205 individuals and 1,363 households that have arrived since 18 April through Renk (Upper Nile), Aweil (Northern Bahr el Ghazal) and Rotriak (Unity).

IOM continues to work with partner organizations in Renk to verify the numbers and work on criteria for determining vulnerabilities, as they observe more arrivals of vulnerable people, including women and children travelling alone. On 27 April IOM DTM recorded a total of 291 third county nationals, a mixture of Ugandans, Kenyans Eritreans, Ethiopians, and Somalians. Most of the arrivals came from Khartoum state, specifically, from the localities of Um Dorman, Kalakala, and Haj Yusif) the arrivals intended final destinations are Renk, Malakal, and Juba. Asylum seekers (Sudanese nationals) were forwarded to the UNHCR desk for further support.

- IOM has deployed a Protection team in Renk to locally support the response. A preliminary safety audit of the transition facility at the former Upper Nile University where returnees and migrants are hosted temporarily has been done. Key risks have been identified and communicated to relevant units to address. Another protection team was deployed to Northern Bahr el Ghazel (Aweil) on 24 April alongside the DTM teams at flow monitoring border points in Kiradem and Jagai.
- Today, IOM airlifted one metric ton of associated medical supplies and medicines to Renk along
 with two health personnel and one MHPSS specialist. Health teams are providing health screening
 at the points of entry and reception centres. The MHPSS specialist will provide psychological first
 aid and counselling services to assess immediate concerns and needs to reduce the stress of people
 escaping the crisis in Sudan.
- 13 metric tons of WASH supplies have been prepositioned in Renk to set up frontline WASH services. The supplies include buckets with lids and taps, water purification tablets (Aqua/pur tabs), multi-purpose soap, menstrual Hygiene management kits, bladder kits (size 20m3), latrine slabs, tarpaulin sheets, DPDI pieces and calcium hypochlorite (65 70 per cent).
- IOM transported 30 Somali students by road from Renk to Paloich airport and subsequently on a charter plane to Juba. IOM is also assisting with assessments, and document checking at Paloich Airport to identify the nationalities of those arriving as well as facilitating communication with respective embassies. The Kenyan embassy in Juba has requested IOM to receive 95 individuals in Renk and provide them transport to Paloich airport tomorrow.
